On this historic day in 1944, Allied troops invaded the beaches of Normandy, France. It is the largest amphibious assault in world history. 156,000 troops from the U.S., Great Britain and Canada stormed five beaches. American troops landed on Omaha and Utah beaches. At the same time, British troops landed on Gold and Sword beach and, Canadian forces landed on Juno beach, 4,000 Allied troops died on the beaches on D-Day. 2,000 of them were American. ## Medicaid: Why We Fundraise

Every year, hundreds of patients and residents rely on Montello Care Center to meet their medical and social needs. As a non-profit organization, we accept residents who have Medicaid insurance although the reimbursement is insufficient. The state of Wisconsin reimburses us \$31.89 less per day, per resident than what it costs us to care for them, resulting in a \$11,640 loss per resident each year.


LOSS PER MONTH
